^{*} The NDIA transitioned to a new data reporting system in February 2021 which did not discriminate between housing support options being sought and, as such, SDA specific requests could not be separated from other housing support option requests such as Individualised Living Options (ILOs), Supported Independent Living (SIL) or Assisted Daily Living (ADL). This was corrected from 1 July 2021 when the NDIA modified the reporting system to again delineate the individual requested supports within each Home and Living request.

^{**} Decisions relating to SDA are only one part of the end to end planning process. All supports need to be related to a participant's disability, value for money, effective and beneficial, and most appropriately funded or provided by the NDIS. Each support must meet reasonable and necessary criteria individually, but the supports must also meet the criteria when considered as a package. For example, once a decision about SDA has been made further consideration about supports for inclusion in a participant's plan may be required including to help a participant build their skills and increase their independence.
