Answer

1. How many Pacific workers arrived in Australia under each of the Seasonal Workers Program and the Pacific Labour Scheme during each of calendar 2019, 2020 and 2021?

The Pacific Labour Scheme commenced in 2018 with the first workers deploying from July onwards that year.

505 workers arrived over the course of 2019, with this number almost doubling by the end of 2020 and then growing to close to 5,000 by the end of 2021.

The SWP commenced in 2012 and had been growing at around 40 per cent per year up to 2019. Reduction from 2019 to 2020 reflects the impact of COVID-19.
