Answer —

- 1. From 1 January 2017 until 30 September 2017, there were 978 visa cancellations made under section 501 of the *Migration Act 1958*.
- 2. The Department acknowledges two people were detained following their release from correctional facilities after their visas were mandatorily cancelled under s501 of the *Migration Act 1958* (please refer to SE17/214 for further information).
