**AE21-388 - Visas granted in family migration stream**

Senator Nick McKim asked:

In the last financial year, how many visas in the family migration stream were granted to applicants sponsored by a person who:

- a. the Department considers to be an “unauthorised maritime arrival”?
- b. holds a protection visa?

*Answer:*

a. Statistics on Family visas granted to applicants sponsored by Illegal Maritime Arrivals (IMAs) cannot be disaggregated from Departmental systems.

b. In 2019-20, a total of 127 Family stream (first and second stage Partner, Prospective Marriage, Contributory Parent, and Child) visas were granted where the sponsor was the current holder of a permanent Protection (subclass 866) visa, or a non-citizen who formerly held a subclass 866 visa.

In 2020-21 as at 31 March 2021, a total of 158 Family stream (first and second stage Partner, Prospective Marriage, Contributory Parent, and Child) visas have been granted where the sponsor was the current holder of a permanent Protection visa, or a non-citizen who formerly held a subclass 866 visa.
