Senator Nick McKim asked:

For the last five financial years, how many unsuccessful permanent protection visa applicants have sought judicial review of their negative decision?

- a. How many have been successful and how many are yet to be decided?
i. Please provide a breakdown by financial year and court.

Answer:

1. In the last five financial years there have been **9,207** unsuccessful permanent protection visa applicants that have sought judicial review.
- a. Of these applications, **913 applicants were successful** in their judicial review applications. As at 31 January 2021, **3,491 application are yet to be decided**. A breakdown of these figures by financial year is provided below:
