Senator Nick McKim asked:

How many detainees in PNG, Nauru, or Australia (as a transitory person/medical transferee) are on pathways to either the US, Canada, or New Zealand?

a. Please provide a breakdown between PNG, Nauru, and Australia (for transitory persons in Australia, please further breakdown between those transferred from PNG and those transferred from Nauru).

*Answer:*

While the Department is aware that a number of individuals in Nauru and Australia are pursuing third country resettlement outside Australian-facilitated arrangements, as those processes are not facilitated by Australia, the Department does not hold definitive numbers of individuals engaged.

In relation to the US resettlement process, as at 31 January 2022:

- Approximately 430\* individuals in Nauru (35), Papua New Guinea (PNG) (40) and temporarily in Australia (355) were engaged in US resettlement.
  - o Of the approximately 355 individuals temporarily in Australia engaged in US resettlement, 310 were from Nauru and 45 were from PNG.

Note: \*Approximate figures, as actual numbers are a matter for the US Government.

Note: The US resettlement arrangement is a voluntary arrangement and individuals can opt in and out at their choosing, therefore numbers are indicative only.
