Senator Nick McKim asked:

How many people seeking asylum are there in Australia who have no income safety net?

a. Please break down by visa subclass.

#### Answer:

Protection visa applicants who are granted an associated Bridging visa, which allows them to remain lawful in the community while their visa application is being processed, may have access to a range of services offered by the Government such as Medicare and the public health system, education for school aged children, assistance with finding employment (if they have work rights), translating and interpreting services, and if eligible, the Australian Government's Status Resolution Support Services (SRSS) Program. If a Bridging visa holder has work rights and has the capacity to work, they are expected to support themselves.

The SRSS program supports non-citizens as they engage with the Department to resolve their immigration status including people who have lodged valid protection visas. The program provides targeted assistance to eligible clients, such as financial assistance, accommodation, access to health care, access to education for school aged children, case worker support and case management.
