The question I would like an answer to is: have ABF officers have made that same jurisdictional error in regards to people from any other countries of origin, or has it just been confined to people from India? Ms C Pearce: There is no confinement to just India. I'll take on notice any other errors of the exact same nature as those you have described.

Answer:

During the period 1 July 2022 – 30 November 2022, ABF cancelled 340 visas at the border. Of the 340 cancellations at the border, 59 involved Indian nationals.

During this period, seven individuals have sought judicial review of the cancellation of their visa. Of these seven, six individuals were of Indian nationality. The Court has quashed, by consent the cancellation decisions with respect to five of these individuals on the basis that the decisions were affected by jurisdictional error. Three of these five cases were affected by jurisdictional errors of similar nature. The Minister successfully defended the remaining case.

Following an internal review, ABF implemented additional measure and training to enhance the visa decision making process for ABF officers at the border.
