Senator Nick McKim: asked the Australian Border Force on 26 February 2018—

- 1. How many asylum seekers, refugees and stateless persons are currently detained in immigration detention facilities, broken down by country of origin, status, gender and age?
- 2. What is the average time in detention for the asylum seekers, refugees and stateless persons currently detained, broken down by status?
- 3. What are the main reasons that stateless people are held in immigration detention?
