### No. 2.—Customs Bill—Consideration of the Senate's Amendments—

Senate Amendment No. 27.—Page 8, after clause 50, insert the following new clause:— 50A. As to all tea imported:

- (a) Samples shall be taken without payment and examined by the Collector.
- (b) Unless the Collector is as a result of the examination satisfied that the tea is not a prohibited import he shall submit the samples for analysis to an official analyst appointed by the Governor-General for the purposes of this
- (c) If as the result of the analysis it appears that the tea is a prohibited import it shall after compliance with the next succeeding paragraph be dealt with accordingly.
- (d) Notice shall be given to the owner of the report of the analyst if the tea is thereby shown to be a prohibited import, A and the owner shall be allowed fourteen days after the receipt of the notice to satisfy the Collector that the tea is not a prohibited import.
- (e) Any tea not complying with the prescribed standard of strength and

purity shall be deemed unfit for human use.

Amendment proposed—That the words "should the owner object to the prohibition the matter may, at his request, be referred in manner prescribed to experts for decision" be inserted after the word "import" in line 2 of paragraph (d) of the proposed new clause.
