No. 1.—Immigration Restriction Bill—Clause 4—

4. The immigration into the Common wealth of the persons described in any of the following paragraphs of this section (hereinafter called "prohibited immigrants") is prohibited, namely:—

٨

- (a) Any person who when asked to do so by an officer fails to write out and sign in the presence of the officer a passage of fifty words in length in the English language dictated by the officer;
- (b) any person likely in the opinion of the Minister or of an officer to become a charge upon the public or upon any public or charitable institution;

(c) any idiot or insane person;

- (d) any person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease of a loathsome or dangerous character;
- (e) any person who has within three years been convicted of an offence, not being a mere political offence, and has been sentenced to imprisonment for one year or longer therefor, and has not received a pardon;
- (f) any prostitute or person living on the prostitution of others.

But the following are excepted:-

"(aa) Any person who is an aboriginal native of Asia, Africa, or of the islands thereof;"—
