THURSDAY, 20TH JUNE, 1901.

1. The House met pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. TEMPORARY CHAIRMEN OF COMMITTEES.—The following Warrant, nominating Temporary Chairmen of Committees, was laid upon the Table by Mr. Speaker:—

3. ADJOURNMENT MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION.—Mr. Cameron rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, “The sufficiency or otherwise of the swearing-in by His Excellency the Governor-General of honorable Members of this House on the 9th May last.” Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and five Members having accordingly risen—  
 Mr. Cameron moved, That the House do now adjourn.  
 Motion, by leave, withdrawn.
4. POSTPONEMENT OF ORDERS OF THE DAY.—Ordered, That the consideration of the Orders of the Day, Government Business, be postponed until after the consideration of Notice of Motion, No. 1, General Business.

5. PAYMENT OF MEMBERS' ALLOWANCE TO MINISTERS OF STATE.—Mr. Glynn moved, pursuant to notice, That, in the opinion of this House, the Ministers of State should not in addition to their salaries receive the allowance of £400 a year payable under section 48 of *The Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act*.

Debate ensued.

Sir John Quick moved, That the question be amended by inserting after the word "House" the words "the provision of section 48 of *The Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act* ought to be altered so as to provide that."

Debate continued.

Proposed amendment, by leave, withdrawn.

Question put—That, in the opinion of this House, the Ministers of State should not in addition to their salaries receive the allowance of £400 a year payable under section 48 of *The Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act*.
