Mr. Barton moved, by leave, That the House do agree to the following Address to His Excellency the Governor-General:—

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY:

We, the Members of the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, in Parliament assembled, respectfully request that Your Excellency will be pleased to forward, by cable, to the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies the accompanying resolution for presentation to the King, with an expression of a respectful hope that His Majesty will be pleased to give instructions for its communication to the President of the United States.

Question—put and resolved in the affirmative.
