- 3. Electoral Bill.—The Order of the Day for the consideration in Committee of the whole House of His Excellency the Acting Governor-General's Message No. 54 having been read—Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.
 - Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; Mr. Chanter reported that the Committee had agreed to a certain resolution.
 - Ordered—That the Report be considered at once.
 - And thereupon the said resolution was read, and is as follows:-
 - Resolved—That it is expedient that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to regulate Parliamentary Elections.
 - And the said resolution was adopted by the House.
- 4. Electoral Bill.—The Order of the Day for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House having been read—Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

 - Resolved—That the House will, on Tuesday next, again resolve itself into the said Committee.
