TUESDAY, 27TH MARCH, 1928.

3. CUSTOMS TARIFF BILL (1927)—SENATE'S REQUESTS.—The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration in Committee of the whole House of the Amendments requested by the Senate (see page 520)—
Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

4. WINE EXPORT BOUNTY BILL (1928).—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—
Debate resumed.

Mr. Parsons addressing the House and not having concluded his speech—the House ordered that the honorable Member have leave to continue his speech when the debate is resumed.

Ordered—That the debate be now adjourned, and that the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
