2. TRANSPORT WORKERS BILL (1929).—The Order of the Day having been read for the second reading—
Mr. Bruce (Prime Minister) moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

4. ADJOURNMENT.—Sir Neville Howse (Minister for Health) moved, That the House do now adjourn.
