1. **The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.**—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Norman J. O. Makin) took the Chair, and offered Prayers.
 2. **THE LATE MR. ROBERT COOK.**—Mr. Speaker informed the House that he had received from Miss Cook, daughter of the late Mr. Robert Cook, a letter thanking the House for its resolution of sympathy.
 3. **PERMANENT COURT OF INTERNATIONAL JUSTICE—APPROVAL OF DECLARATION UNDER ARTICLE 36 OF THE STATUTE.**—Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister) moved, pursuant to notice, That this House approves of the Declaration under Article 36 of the Statute of the Permanent Court of International Justice, signed at Geneva on 20th September, 1929, in respect of the Commonwealth of Australia.
Mr. Latham moved, That the debate be now adjourned.
Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.
Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
 4. **CONCILIATION AND ARBITRATION BILL (1930).**—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—
