# MONDAY, 4TH AUGUST, 1930.

- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.--Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Norman J. O. Makin) took the Chair, and offered Prayers.
- 2. ALTERATION OF HOUR OF NEXT MEETING .- Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until half-past two o'clock p.m. to-morrow. Question—put and passed.
- 3. POSTFONEMENT OF NOTICE OF MOTION .- Ordered -- That the consideration of Notice of Motion No. 1, Government Business, be postponed until to-morrow.
- 4. SUPPLY [ESTIMATES 1930-31].—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

#### (In the Committee.)

Postponed Vote-"The Department of Trade and Customs, £913,100" further debated and agreed to.

Postponed Vote--The Department of Health, £135,000 "-debated-

Mr. Bayley moved, as an amendment, That the first item of Division No. 96, viz. : -Director-General, £2,000-be reduced by 1s.

Debate continued.

Amendment, by leave, withdrawn.

Vote agreed to.

Postponed Vote—" Miscellaneous Services, £782,650 "—debated and agreed to. Postponed Vote—" Refunds of Revenue, £1,100,000 "—agreed to.

Postponed Vote--- "Grant to States towards Relief of Unemployment, £1,000,000 "-- debated and agreed to.

Mr. Scullin (Treasurer) moved, That the following resolution be reported to the House : -

That, including the sum already voted for such services, there be granted to His Majesty to defray the charges for the year 1930-31, for the several services hereunder specified, a sum not exceeding £24,840,529.

Resolved-That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

- 5. SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS .- Mr. Scullin (Treasurer) moved, pursuant to contingent notice, That the Standing Orders be suspended, to enable the remaining stages to be passed without delay. Question—put and passed.
- 6. SUPPLY RESOLUTION.—The Resolution reported from the Committee of Supply was read, and, on the motion of Mr. Scullin (Treasurer), was adopted by the House.
- 7. WAYS AND MEANS [ESTIMATES 1930-31] .- The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.

# (In the Committee.)

Estimates 1930-31.

Mr. Scullin (Treasurer) moved, That, towards making good the Supply granted to His Majesty for the services of the year 1930-31, there be granted out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a sum not exceeding £17,204,259.

Question—put and passed.

Resolution to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed ; Mr. McGrath reported accordingly.

Resolved-That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

- The Resolution reported from the Committee was read, and, on the motion of Mr. Scullin, was adopted by the House.
- Ordered-That Mr. Scullin and Mr. Fenton do prepare and bring in a Bill to carry out the foregoing Resolution.
- 8. APPROPRIATION BILL 1930-31 .- Mr. Scullin (Treasurer) then brought up a Bill intituled "A Bill for an Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a sum for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one and to appropriate the Supplies granted by the Parliament for such year," and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time. Mr. Scullin moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time. Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

# (In the Committee.)

Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to, after debate.

Bill to be reported without amendment.

The House resumed ; Mr. McGrath reported accordingly.

On the motion of Mr. Scullin, the House adopted the Report, and the Bill was read a third time.
