- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Norman J. O. Makin) took the Chair, and offered Prayers.
- 2. Postponement of Order of the Day No. 1 be postponed until after Order of the Day No. 2, Government Business.
- 3. Representation Bill (1930).—The Order of the Day having been read for the second reading—Mr. Blakeley (Minister for Home Affairs) moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Mr. Earle Page moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.

Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

4. INCOME TAX ASSESSMENT BILL (No. 2) (1930).—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time-

Debate resumed by Mr. Earle Page, who moved, as an amendment, That all the words after "That" be omitted and that the following words be inserted in lieu thereof: -" this House is of opinion that the Government, instead of encroaching upon the State field of taxation contrary to the express undertaking given by the Government at the Melbourne Conference, should reduce expenditure to an extent sufficient to obviate the need for increase of income taxation, and that the Bill should be withdrawn ".

Debate continued.

Question—That the words proposed to be omitted stand part of the question—put. The House divided (The Deputy-Speaker, Mr. McGrath, in the Chair)—

The House resumed; Mr. Keane reported accordingly. Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

5. Adjournment.—Mr. Fenton (Acting Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued.

Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at one minute to twelve o'clock midnight, adjourned until to-morrow at eleven o'clock a.m.
