THURSDAY, 4TH JUNE, 1931.

1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Norman J. O. Makin) took the Chair, and offered Prayers.
2. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO WHEAT-GROWERS.—Mr. Parker Moloney (Minister for Markets), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement regarding the correspondence between the Commonwealth Government and the Commonwealth Bank of Australia with reference to the question of providing finance for the payments proposed under the Wheat Marketing Bill. Mr. Gullett, by leave, also made a Statement with reference to the matter.
3. NORTHERN TERRITORY (ADMINISTRATION) BILL (1931).—Mr. Blakeley (Minister for Home Affairs) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the *Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910-1931*.
Question—put and passed.
Mr. Blakeley then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.
Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.
Mr. Blakeley moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time.
Debate ensued.
Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.
Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to.
Bill to be reported without amendment.
