Raith, Kirkcaldy,

22nd January, 1935.

My dear Governor-General,

I have to thank you for your letter of November the 23rd, enclosing a letter from the Prime Minister informing you that he was sending me a bound copy of the Resolutions and Speeches delivered in the two Houses of Parliament on the occasion of Lord Novar's death. This, together with the unbound copies, has now arrived, and I would ask you to convey to
