Hughes of his appointments to be Minister of State for Health and Minister of State for Repatriation, and also of his appointment to be the Vice-President of the Federal Executive Council, and that the Governor-General had this day appointed the Right Honorable Joseph Aloysius Lyons, Prime Minister, to be also Minister of State for Health and Minister of State for Repatriation, and, in addition, to be Vice-President of the Federal Executive Council.
- 6. Supply—Estimates, 1935-36.—The House, according to Order, again resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.
