2. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—ITALO-ABYSSINIAN DISPUTE.—Mr. Earle Page (Minister for Commerce), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House that a Note of Protest had been received by the Commonwealth Government from the Government of Italy in regard to the application of Sanctions, and that a communication had been received from the League of Nations in connexion with new proposals by the Sanctions Co-ordination Committee.
3. PAPER.—Mr. Speaker presented, pursuant to Statute—  
Audit Act—Finance—Treasurer's Statement of Receipts and Expenditure for year ended 30th June, 1935, accompanied by the Report of the Auditor-General.

MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—SIR CHARLES KINGSFORD SMITH.—Mr. Parkhill (Minister for Defence), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of the further steps taken in carrying out a search for Air-Commodore Sir Charles Kingsford Smith, missing on an aeroplane flight between England and Australia.

6. MEAT EXPORT CONTROL BILL.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—

“ during the continuance of this Act,”.

No. 2.—Page 5, clause 11, line 4, after “ for ” (second occurring) insert “—

(a) providing for the establishment of a clearing office for the receipt, custody and payment, in such manner as is specified in the regulations, of moneys due by persons in Australia or its Territories to persons in Italy, in such cases or classes of cases as are so specified ;

(b) requiring, in such cases or classes of cases as are specified in the regulations, persons in Australia or its Territories owing moneys to persons in Italy to pay those moneys to the account of a clearing office established in accordance with this Act ;

(c) providing for the prohibition or avoidance of contracts for the assignment of debts due by persons in Australia or its Territories to persons in Italy ; and

(d) ”.
