5. Message from the Governor-General.—War Service Homes Bill (1935).—The following Message from His Excellency the Governor-General was presented, and was read by Mr. Speaker:

ISAAC A. ISAACS,

Governor-General.

Message No. 59.

In accordance with the requirements of section fifty-six of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Governor-General recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of Revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to amend the War Service Homes Act 1918-1934.

Canberra, 31st October, 1935.

Ordered--That the foregoing Message be taken into consideration, in Committee of the whole House, forthwith.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

#### (In the Committee.)

Mr. Thorby (Minister in charge of War Service Homes) moved. That it is expedient that an appropriation of Revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to amend the War Service Homes Act 1918-1934.

The said Resolution was read, and, on the motion of Mr. Thorby, by leave, was adopted by the House.

6. WAR SERVICE HOMES BILL (1935).—The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House—Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

7. Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Bill (1935).—Mr. Lyons (Minister for Repatriation), pursuant to leave given on the 15th instant, brought up a Bill intituled "A Bill for an Act to amend the 'Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Act 1920–1934'", and moved, That it be now read a first time. Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Mr. Lyons moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Mr. Curtin (Leader of the Opposition) moved, That the debate be now adjourned. Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.
