1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. J. Bell) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. DEATH OF MEMBER (MR. D. RIORDAN).—Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister) having announced, with deep regret, the death, this day, of Mr. David Riordan, moved, by leave, That this House expresses its profound regret at the death of Mr. David Riordan, Member for the Division of Kennedy, places on record its appreciation of his meritorious public service, and tenders to his widow and family its heartfelt sympathy in their bereavement.
And Mr. Curtin (Leader of the Opposition) having seconded the motion, and other honorable Members having addressed the House in support thereof, and all Members present having risen, in silence—
Question—passed.
Resolved—That Mr. Speaker be requested to transmit to the widow of the late Mr. Riordan the foregoing Resolution, together with a copy of the speeches delivered thereon.
3. ALTERATION OF DAY OF NEXT MEETING.—Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until Wednesday next at three o'clock p.m.
Question—put and passed.
4. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister) then moved, as a mark of respect to the memory of the late honorable gentleman, That the House do now adjourn.
Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at thirteen minutes past eleven o'clock a.m., adjourned until Wednesday next at three o'clock p.m.
