#### WEDNESDAY, 8TH JUNE, 1938.

- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. J. Bell) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Adjournment-Motion for Purpose of Discussion.—Mr. Forde rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The failure of the Government to encourage the manufacture in Australia of motor car chassis, &c., in accordance with the policy enunciated by the Minister directing negotiations for Trade Treaties (Sir Henry Gullett) on the 22nd May, 1936".

Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly—

Mr. Forde moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued.

Sir Henry Gullett addressing the House and not having concluded his speech at the termination of the time allowed by Standing Order No. 257B—

Ordered—That the honorable Member have leave to continue his speech.

Debate continued.

The debate having been continued for two hours, it was terminated in accordance with Standing Order No. 257B.

3. NATIONAL HEALTH AND PENSIONS INSURANCE BILL 1938.—The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House—

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

### (In the Committee.)

Clause 18-

Mr. Holloway proposing to move, as an amendment, That the following proviso be added:—
"Provided that a person who has not been employed may be insured as a voluntary contributor if he complies with the provisions of paragraphs (c) and (d) of this section."—

Chairman's Ruling.—The Chairman (Mr. Prowse) ruled that such an amendment would have the effect of bringing in additional contributors resulting in increased expenditure from the Consolidated Revenue, and, therefore, would not be in order.

Mr. Holloway moved, That the clause be postponed.

Debate ensued.

Question—That the clause be postponed—put.
