- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.-Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. J. Bell) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. DEATH OF LORD STANLEY.—Sir Earle Page (Minister for Commerce) moved, by leave, That this House expresses its deep regret at the death of the Right Honorable Lord Stanley, Secretary of State for Dominion Affairs, places on record its appreciation of his distinguished service to the British Commonwealth, and tenders to his widow and family its profound sympathy in their sad bereavement and also to the United Kingdom Government in the loss which it has sustained.
 - And Mr. Curtin (Leader of the Opposition) having seconded the motion, and all Members present having risen, in silence-

- Question—passed. Resolved—That Mr. Speaker be requested to transmit the foregoing Resolution, together with a copy of the speeches delivered thereon, to Lady Stanley and to the United Kingdom Government.
- 3. LOAN COUNCIL-MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.-Sir Earle Page (Minister for Commerce), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement regarding the subjects to be discussed at the meeting of the Loan Council to be held on Friday, 21st October.

Mr. Curtin (Leader of the Opposition), by leave, also made a Statement with reference to the matter.

- 6. INTER-STATE COMMISSION BILL 1938 .- The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time-Debate resumed.


