2. AEROPLANE ACCIDENT—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.—Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of an aeroplane accident which occurred at Mount Dandenong, Victoria, to-day.
3. WANT OF CONFIDENCE—NOTICE OF MOTION.—Mr. Curtin (Leader of the Opposition) gave notice of a motion of Want of Confidence which he proposed to move to-morrow.
4. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn.
