If return is made in respect of property held on trust property of a company or property of an electric fill in respect of property held on trust, property of a company or property of an absentee, fill in column (B) but not column (A)".

Penalty: Fifty pounds or imprisonment for three months.".

- And then the House, at twenty-five minutes past six o'clock p.m., adjourned until a date and hour to be fixed by Mr. Speaker, and to be notified by him to each Member by telegram or letter as determined by Resolution of the House at this sitting.
