- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment. -Mr. Speaker (the Honorable W. M. Nairn) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. DEATH OF THE HONORABLE J. C. WATSON.—Mr. Curtin (Prime Minister) informed the House of the death this morning of the Honorable J. C. Watson, and moved, That this House expresses its profound regret at the death of the Honorable John Christian Watson, a former Member of the New South Wales and Commonwealth Parliaments, and Prime Minister and Treasurer of the Commonwealth from April to August, 1904, places on record its appreciation of his distinguished public service, and tenders its deep sympathy to his widow and daughter in their bereavement.

And Mr. Hughes having seconded the motion, and Mr. Spooner having addressed the House in support

thereof, and all Members present having risen, in silence

Question passed.

- 3. Suspension of Sitting as Mark of Respect. -As a mark of respect to the memory of the deceased gentleman, the sitting was thereupon suspended until eight o'clock p.m.
- 4. RESUMPTION OF SITTING. -At eight o'clock p.m., Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.
- 5. PRICE OF TEA-MINISTERIAL STATEMENT. Mr. Curtin (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of the basis for the determination of the price of tea in Australia and of the reasons for the recent increase in price.
- 6. Cash and Conversion Loan-Ministerial Statement.-Mr. Chifley (Treasurer), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement announcing that the £100,000,000 Cash and Conversion Loan had been fully subscribed.

"(2.) The amendments effected by the last preceding sub-section, in so far as they omit Division III. of the Second Schedule to the Principal Act, shall not apply to any goods covered by that Division which are for use in the construction of any irrigation, water supply, drainage or sewerage works carried out on behalf of any public authority charged with the construction of any such works, if the construction is in pursuance of a contract or agreement entered into prior to the thirtieth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one.".

Debate ensued.

Amendment negatived.

Clause, as amended, agreed to.

Clause 5-

On the motion of Mr. Lazzarini, the following amendment was made:-

Page 4, after line 36 insert the following paragraph:-

(da) by omitting from Item 2 the words 'and floral tributes covered by Item 45 in the Second Schedule to this Act';".

Mr. Harrison moved, as a further amendment, That proposed sub-item (12) of Item 10 be omitted. Debate ensued.

The Resolutions reported from the Committee were read, and, on the motion of Mr. Lazzarini, were adopted by the House.

Ordered-That Mr. Lazzarini and Mr. Chifley do prepare and bring in Bills to carry out the foregoing Resolutions.

10. Suspension of Standing Orders to enable the Sales Tax Bills to be considered together.—
Mr. Lazzarini (Minister assisting the Treasurer) moved, by leave, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent the questions in regard to the first and second readings, Committee's report stage, and third readings being put in one motion covering several or all of the Sales Tax Bills Nos. 1 to 9, and the consideration of several or all of such Bills together in a Committee of the Whole.
