## FRIDAY, 27TH MARCH, 1942.

- The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable W. M. Nairn) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. ADJOURNMENT-MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION.—Mr. Fadden (Leader of the Opposition) rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The disclosure in the House of Representatives on the 26th March, 1942, by the Minister for the Army of a treasonable plot". Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly—Mr. Fadden moved, That the House do now adjourn.
  Debate ensued.
- The debate having been continued for two hours, it was terminated in accordance with Standing Order No. 257B.
- 3. POSTPONEMENT OF BUSINESS.—Ordered—That the intervening Business be postponed until after Notices of Motion Nos. 1 to 5, General Business.
- 4. REGULATIONS—MOTION FOR DISALLOWANCE.—Mr. Spender moved, pursuant to notice, That the Amendments of the National Security (Man Power) Regulations made by Statutory Rules 1942, No. 102, be disallowed.

Debate ensued.

Mr. Brennan moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.

Ordered-That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
