4. The War-Ministerial Statement, 29th April, 1942—Printing of Paper.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the following motion of Mr. Curtin (Prime Minister), That the Paper [presented on the 29th April], viz.:—

be printed—

Debate resumed by Mr. Fadden (Leader of the Opposition) who moved, as an amendment, That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof:—
", in order that the Australian Imperial Force and the Australian Military Forces may be effectively welded into one fighting army available for offence as well as defence, this House is of opinion that all territorial limitations upon the power of the Commonwealth Government to employ Australian Military Forces should be removed".

Debate continued.

Question—That the words proposed to be omitted stand part of the question—put.
