- 7. Order under National Security Act-Ministerial Statement.-Mr. Makin (Minister for Munitions), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement with reference to the application of the Electricity Generator and Engine Investigation Order issued under the National Security Act.
- 8. Public Works Committee—Appointment of Member.—Mr. Curtin (Prime Minister) moved, by leave, That Mr. Mulcahy be appointed a member of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works, in the place of Mr. Stacey, resigned. Question—put and passed.
