- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. S. Rosevear) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Member Sworn.—The Honorable Sir Frederick Harold Stewart made and subscribed the Oath required by law.
- 3. Australian Advisory War Council—Ministerial Statement.—Mr. Curtin (Prime Minister) informed the House that the Australian Advisory War Council would continue to function with the following membership:—

Representatives of the Government: Mr. Curtin, Mr. Forde, Mr. Evatt, Mr. Beasley and Mr. Makin.

Representatives of the Opposition Parties: Mr. Menzies, Mr. Hughes, Mr. Spender, Mr. Fadden and Mr. McEwen.

- 4. HIGH COMMISSIONER IN THE UNITED KINGDOM—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.—Mr. Curtin (Prime Minister), by leave, informed the House that the Rt. Hon. S. M. Bruce, C.H., M.C., had been re-appointed as High Commissioner of the Commonwealth in the United Kingdom for a period of one year from the 7th October. Mr. Curtin announced that Mr. Bruce would continue to act as the Australian Accredited Representative on the Imperial War Cabinet, and as His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary for the Commonwealth of Australia in the Kingdom of the Netherlands.
- 5. The Late Honorable D. J. O'Keefe.—Mr. Speaker informed the House that he had received from Mrs. O'Keefe a letter thanking the House for its Resolution of sympathy.
- 6. The Late Mr. J. T. H. Whitsitt.—Mr. Speaker informed the House that he had received from Mrs. Whitsitt a letter thanking the House for its Resolution of sympathy.

11. Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Bill (No. 2) 1943.—Mr. Chifley (Treasurer) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943.

Question—put and passed.

Mr. Chifley then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.
Mr. Chifley moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate ensued.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to.

Bill to be reported without amendment.

The House resumed; Mr. Riordan reported accordingly.

On the motion of Mr. Chifley, the House adopted the Report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.

- 13. Ways and Means-Sales Tax.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.

(In the Committee.)

Mr. Chifley (Treasurer) moved the following eleven motions-

- (1.) That in lieu of the rate of tax imposed by the Sales Tax Act (No. 1) 1930-1942 sales tax be imposed upon the sale value of goods, manufactured in Australia by a taxpayer and on or after the twenty-first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, sold by him or treated by him as stock for sale by retail or applied to his own use, at the rate of-
 - (a) in respect of goods covered by the Second Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943—7½ per centum;
 (b) in respect of goods covered by the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and

Classifications) Act 1935-1943-25 per centum; and

(c) in respect of goods not covered by the Second Schedule or the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943 and on the sale value of which it is not provided by that Act that sales tax shall not be payable—121 per

- (2.) That in lieu of the rate of tax imposed by the Sales Tax Act (No. 2) 1930-1942 sales tax be imposed upon the sale value of goods, manufactured in Australia and sold on or after the twentyfirst day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, by a taxpayer who purchased them from the manufacturer, at the rate of-
 - (a) in respect of goods covered by the Second Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943—7½ per centum;

 (b) in respect of goods covered by the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and

Classifications) Act 1935-1943-25 per centum; and

- (c) in respect of goods not covered by the Second Schedule or the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943 and on the sale value of which it is not provided by that Act that sales tax shall not be payable—123 per
- (3.) That in lieu of the rate of tax imposed by the Sales Tax Act (No. 3) 1930-1942 sales tax be imposed upon the sale value of goods, manufactured in Australia and sold on or after the twentyfirst day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, by a taxpayer not being either the manufacturer of those goods or the purchaser of those goods from the manufacturer, at the rate of-
 - (a) in respect of goods covered by the Second Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and

Classifications) Act 1935-1943—7½ per centum;

(b) in respect of goods covered by the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943—25 per centum; and

- (c) in respect of goods not covered by the Second Schedule or the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943 and on the sale value of which it is not provided by that Act that sales tax shall not be payable—123 per
- (4.) That in lieu of the rate of tax imposed by the Sales Tax Act (No. 4) 1930-1942 sales tax be imposed upon the sale value of goods, manufactured in Australia and sold to a taxpayer who has, on or after the twenty-first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, applied those goods to his own use, at the rate of-
 - (a) in respect of goods covered by the Second Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943-72 per centum;
 (b) in respect of goods covered by the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and

Classifications) Act 1935-1943-25 per centum; and

- (c) in respect of goods not covered by the Second Schedule or the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943 and on the sale value of which it is not provided by that Act that sales tax shall not be payable—123 per
- (5.) That in lieu of the rate of tax imposed by the Sales Tax Act (No. 5) 1930-1942 sales tax be imposed upon the sale value of goods, imported into Australia by a taxpayer on or after the twentyfirst day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, at the rate of-
 - (a) in respect of goods covered by the Second Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943—7\frac{1}{2} per centum;
 (b) in respect of goods covered by the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and
 - Classifications) Act 1935-1943—25 per centum; and
 - (c) in respect of goods not covered by the Second Schedule or the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943 and on the sale value of which it is not provided by that Act that sales tax shall not be payable—122 per
- (6.) That in lieu of the rate of tax imposed by the Sales Tax Act (No. 6) 1930-1942 sales tax be imposed upon the sale value of goods, imported into Australia by a taxpayer and, on or after the twenty-first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, sold by him or applied by him to his own use, at the rate of-
 - (a) in respect of goods covered by the Second Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and
 - Classifications) Act 1935-1943—7½ per centum;
 (b) in respect of goods covered by the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943—25 per centum; and
 - (c) in respect of goods not covered by the Second Schedule or the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943 and on the sale value of which it is not provided by that Act that sales tax shall not be payable—123 per
- (7.) That in lieu of the rate of tax imposed by the Sales Tax Act (No. 7) 1930-1942 sales tax be imposed upon the sale value of goods, imported into Australia and sold on or after the twenty-first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, by a taxpayer not being the importer of the goods, at the rate of-
 - (a) in respect of goods covered by the Second Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943—7½ per centum;
 (b) in respect of goods covered by the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and
 - Classifications) Act 1935-1943—25 per centum; and
 - (c) in respect of goods not covered by the Second Schedule or the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943 and on the sale value of which it is not provided by that Act that sales tax shall not be payable—122 per

6th October, 1943.

- (8.) That in lieu of the rate of tax imposed by the Sales Tax Act (No. 8) 1930-1942 sales tax be imposed upon the sale value of goods, imported into Australia and sold to a taxpayer who has, on or after the twenty-first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, applied those goods to his own use, at the rate of-
 - (a) in respect of goods covered by the Second Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943-71 per centum;
 - (b) in respect of goods covered by the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943-25 per centum; and
 - (c) in respect of goods not covered by the Second Schedule or the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943 and on the sale value of which it is not provided by that Act that sales tax shall not be payable—12½ per
- (9.) That in lieu of the rate of tax imposed by the Sales Tax Act (No. 9) 1930-1942 sales tax be imposed upon the sale value of goods in Australia, including goods which have gone into use or consumption in Australia, leased by a taxpayer to a lessee on or after the twenty-first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, at the rate of-
 - (a) in respect of goods covered by the Second Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943-7; per centum;
 - (b) in respect of goods covered by the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943-25 per centum; and
 - (c) in respect of goods not covered by the Second Schedule or the Third Schedule to the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1943 and on the sale value of which it is not provided by that Act that sales tax shall not be payable—12½ per
- (10.) That, for the purposes of the foregoing resolutions, "Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act " means the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act 1935-1942 as proposed to be amended by the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Bill 1943.
- (11.) That the Acts to give effect to the foregoing resolutions be expressed to be deemed to have come into operation on the twenty-first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three.

Motions agreed to.

Resolutions to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Riordan reported accordingly.
Resolved—That the House will, at a later hour this day, again resolve itself into the said Committee. Mr. Chifley moved, by leave, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent the remaining stages being passed without delay.

Question—put and passed.

The Resolutions reported from the Committee were read, and, on the motion of Mr. Chifley, were adopted by the House.

Ordered.—That Mr. Chifley and Mr. Lazzarini do prepare and bring in Bills to carry out the foregoing Resolutions.

- 14. Suspension of Standing Orders to enable the Sales Tax Bills to be considered together.— Mr. Chifley (Treasurer) moved, by leave, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent the questions in regard to the first and second readings, Committee's report stage, and third readings being put in one motion covering several or all of the Sales Tax Bills Nos. 1 to 9, and the consideration of several or all of such Bills together in a Committee of the Whole. Question—put and passed.
