RELEASE OF ARMY PERSONNEL FOR RURAL WORK-MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.-Mr. Forde (Minister for the Army), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement announcing certain details of procedure regarding the recent decision of the Government to release 20,000 Army personnel by June next for relieving man power shortages in rural industries.
- 3. PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE—REFERENCE OF WORK—ADDITIONS TO GOVERNMENT OFFICES, CANBERRA.—Mr. Lazzarini (Minister representing the Minister for the Interior) moved, by leave, That, in accordance with the provisions of the Commonwealth Public Works Committee Act 1913–1936, the following proposed work be referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works for investigation and report :—Additions to the Government Offices known as "West Block", Canberra.
