- 2. ALTERATION OF HOUR OF NEXT MEETING.—Mr. Chifley (Acting Prime Minister) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m. Question—put and passed.
- 3. Paper.—Mr. Speaker presented, pursuant to Statute—

Audit Act -- Finance -- Treasurer's Statement of Receipts and Expenditure for year 1943-44, accompanied by the Report of the Auditor-General.

4. NATIONAL SECURITY (LANDLORD AND TENANT) REGULATIONS-STATEMENT BY MEMBER. - Mr. Holt, by leave, made a Statement with reference to certain proposals for amending the National Security (Landlord and Tenant) Regulations.

Mr. Chifley (Acting Prime Minister), by leave, also made a Statement regarding the matter.

5. Invalid and Old-Age Pensions Bill 1945.—Mr. Holloway (Minister representing the Minister for Social Services) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the Invalid and Old-age Pensions Act 1908-1944.

'Provided also that shares shall be purchased or otherwise acquired only with a view

to resale thereof.

"(2.) Nothing in this section shall empower the Commonwealth Bank to purchase or otherwise acquire shares or securities except for the purpose of providing finance as prescribed under paragraph (a) of the last preceding section.".
