PROPOSED MOTION OF PRIVILEGE.—Mr. Anthony proposing to move, as a motion of Privilege, "That an honorable Member who has asked a Question of a Minister should be supplied with the written answer before the answer is circulated or printed in Hansard "-Speaker's Ruling.—Mr. Speaker ruled that the matter was not one of Privilege.
- 3. PROPOSED ADJOURNMENT-MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION.-Mr. Menzies (Leader of the Opposition) proposing to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The continued employment in the Armed Forces of men with five years' service, including service abroad "-

Speaker's Ruling.—Mr. Speaker ruled that such a motion would not be in order as it anticipated

Order of the Day No. 10, Government Business.

Suspension of Standing Orders moved.—Mr. Menzies moved, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent the Motion for the Adjournment of the House being proceeded with. Debate ensued.

5. Commonwealth Inscribed Stock Bill 1945.-Mr. Chifley (Treasurer) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to being in a Bill for an Act to amend the Commonwealth Inscribed Stock Act

Question—put and passed.

Mr. Chifley then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Mr. Chifley moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Mr. Fadden moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question-That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.

Ordered-That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

6. NATIONAL DEBT SINKING FUND BILL 1945.—Mr. Chifley (Treasurer) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the National Debt Sinking Fund Act 1923-1934. Question—put and passed.

Mr. Chifley then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed. - Bill read a first time.

Mr. Chifley moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Mr. Fadden moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question- That the debate be now adjourned-put and passed.

Ordered-That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

7. Commonwealth Public Service Bill 1945.—Mr. Dedman (Minister for Post-war Reconstruction) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to provide for the appointment to or employment in the Commonwealth Service of certain State Employees, and for other purposes.

Question—put and passed.

8. Superannuation Bill (No. 2) 1945.—Mr. Lazzarini (Minister for Works and Housing) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the Superannuation Act 1922-1943, as amended by the Superannuation Act 1945.

Question—put and passed.

Mr. Lazzarini then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Mr. Lazzarini moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Mr. Holt moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.

Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

9. Papua-New Guinea Provisional Administration Bill 1945.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time-And on the Amendment moved thereto by Mr. White, viz. :- That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof:-" the Bill be withdrawn and referred to a Select Committee for report as to whether the Bill meets the requirements of the Territories concerned, and to seek advice upon the best methods for restoring Civil Administration, for the welfare of the native population and for the economic development of Papua and New Guinea "-

Debate resumed.

Question—That the words proposed to be omitted stand part of the question—put.

Mr. White moved, as an amendment, That the word "Governor-General" (page 2, line 44) be omitted with a view to inserting the word "Administrator" in place thereof.

Debate ensued.

Amendment negatived.

Clause agreed to.

Clauses 9 to 13 agreed to.

Clause 14 debated and agreed to.

Clause 15 debated and agreed to.

Clause 16 debated and agreed to. Clause 17 agreed to.

Schedule agreed to.

Title agreed to.

Bill to be reported without amendment.

The House resumed; Mr. Riordan reported accordingly.

Mr. Ward (Minister for External Territories) moved, That the Report be adopted.
Mr. White moved, That the Bill be now recommitted to a Committee of the whole House for the reconsideration of clause 14.

Debate ensued.

Question—put and negatived.

Question—That the Report be adopted—put and passed.

On the motion of Mr. Ward, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.

10. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at ten minutes to eleven o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m.
