#### THURSDAY, 13TH SEPTEMBER, 1945.

- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. S. Rosevear) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. DURATION OF NATIONAL SECURITY ACT AND CONTINUATION OF WAR LOADINGS—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.—Mr. Beasley (Acting Attorney-General), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement with reference to the time the National Security Act will continue in force and to the period during which war loadings in industry will remain.
- 3. Paper.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute—Customs Act—Regulations—Statutory Rules 1945, No. 125.
- 4. Commonwealth and State Housing Agreement Bill 1945.—Mr. Dedman (Minister for Post-war Reconstruction) moved, by leave, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to authorize the Execution by or on behalf of the Commonwealth of an Agreement between the Commonwealth and the States in relation to Housing, and for other purposes.

Question—put and passed.

Mr. Dedman then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Mr. Dedman moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Mr. Menzies (Leader of the Opposition) moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.

Ordered-That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

5. Supply—Budget Debate.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

#### (In the Committee.)

General debate resumed on the question, That the first item in the Estimates, under Division No. 1—The Senate—namely—

Salaries and allowances

£8,820

be agreed to.

Mr. Menzies (Leader of the Opposition) moved, as an amendment, That the first item be reduced by £1. Debate continued.

Mr. White moved, That Mr. Cameron be granted an extension of time,
