3. CONSTITUTION ALTERATION (SOCIAL SERVICES) BILL 1946.-Mr. Evatt (Attorney-General) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to alter the Constitution by empowering the Parliament to make Laws for the Provision of Maternity Allowances, Widows' Pensions, Child Endowment, Unemployment, Sickness and Hospital Benefits, Medical and Dental Services, Benefits to Students and Family Allowances.

Question—put and passed. Mr. Evatt then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time. Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time. Ordered—That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

4. CONSTITUTION ALTERATION (ORGANIZED MARKETING OF PRIMARY PRODUCTS) BILL 1946 .--- Mr. Evatt (Attorney-General) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to alter the Constitution by empowering the Parliament to make Laws providing for the Organized Marketing of Primary Products, unrestricted by section ninety-two of the Constitution. Question—put and passed.

Mr. Evatt then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question-put and passed. - Bill read a first time.

Ordered--That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

5. ('ONSTITUTION ALTERATION (INDUSTRIAL EMPLOYMENT) BILL 1946.-Mr. Evatt (Attorney-General) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to alter the Constitution by empowering the Parliament to make Laws with respect to Terms and Conditions of Employment in Industry.

Question—put and passed.

Mr. Evatt then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time. Question-put and passed. -Bill read a first time.

Ordered - That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

6. Foreign Affairs -Missions Overseas-Ministerial Statement-Printing of Paper.-The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the following motion of Mr. Evatt (Minister for External Affairs), That the Paper [presented on the 13th March, 1946], viz. :--Foreign Affairs Missions Overseas-Ministerial Statement, 13th March, 1946 --
