 2. ALTERATION OF DAY OF NEXT MEETING.—Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until Wednesday next at three o'clock p.m.
Question—put and passed.
 3. PAPER.—The following Paper was presented, by Command of His Royal Highness the Governor-General—
International Labour Organization of the League of Nations—Twenty-seventh Session, Paris, October–November, 1945—Report of the Australian Government and Employers' Delegates.
Ordered to lie on the Table, and to be printed.
 4. MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE.—PARLIAMENTARY PROCEEDINGS BROADCASTING BILL 1946.—Mr. Speaker announced the receipt of the following Message from the Senate :—

The Senate has passed a Bill for "*An Act to provide for the Broadcasting of the Proceedings of the Houses of the Parliament, and for other purposes*", and transmits the same to the House of Representatives for its concurrence.

Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
 5. SUPPLY BILL (No. 1) 1946-47.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—
Debate resumed.
Ordered—That Mr. Fadden be granted an extension of time.
Mr. Conelan moved, That the debate be now adjourned.
Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.
Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
 6. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Makin (Minister for the Navy) moved, That the House do now adjourn.
Debate ensued.
Ordered—That Mr. Hutchinson be granted an extension of time.
Debate continued.
Question—put and passed.
- And then the House, at eight minutes to five o'clock p.m., adjourned until Wednesday next at three o'clock p.m.
