- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. S. Rosevear) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. ALTERATION OF HOUR OF NEXT MEETING .- Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m. Debate ensued. Question—put and passed.
- 3. PRESENTATION OF ADDRESS IN REPLY.—Mr. Speaker reported that, accompanied by honorable Members, he had waited that day upon His Royal Highness the Governor-General at Government House, and had presented to him the Address in Reply to His Royal Highness's Speech on the Opening of the First Session of the Eighteenth Parliament, agreed to by the House on the 7th November, and that His Royal Highness had been pleased to make the following reply:—

MR. SPEAKER,

I desire to thank you for the Address in Reply, which you have just presented to me.

It will afford me much pleasure to convey to His Most Gracious Majesty The King the message of loyalty from the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia to which the Address gives expression.

- 4. Election Petition.—The Clerk laid upon the Table a copy of an Election Petition which he had received from the District Registrar of the High Court, at Sydney, under section 196 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act, viz.:—Petition of Ronald Grafton Sarina against the return of William Paul O'Connor as Member for West Sydney.

Defence (Transitional Provisions) Bill 1946.—Mr. Evatt (Attorney-General) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to make provision for the Security and Defence of the Commonwealth during a Time of Transition from War Conditions to Conditions of Peace, and for other purposes.

Question—put and passed.

7. Supply—Budget Debate.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

(In the Committee.)

General debate resumed on the question, That the first item in the Estimates, under Division No. 1.—Senate—namely—

Salaries and allowances

£8,870

be agreed to.

Mr. Menzies (Leader of the Opposition) moved, as an amendment, That the first item be reduced by £1. Debate continued.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Clark reported accordingly.

Resolved-That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

8. Adjournment.—Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued.

Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at seventeen minutes past ten o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m.
