Prisoners of War-Subsistence Allowance-Ministerial Statement. -Mr. Chambers (Minister for the Army), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement with respect to a proposal that a subsistence allowance should be paid to prisoners of war for the time they were held by the Japanese. Mr. Turnbull, by leave, also made a Statement with reference to the matter.
- 3. ADJOURNMENT-MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION. Mr. Anthony rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The urgent necessity for a substantial increase in the price of butter in order that justice may be accorded those engaged in butter production, and that production may be stimulated ".

Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly—

"(2A.) Where a direction is given orally, the Commission shall, within twenty-four hours thereafter, record the direction in writing.".

Amendment amended by Mr. Evatt, by leave, by adding the words "and shall immediately confirm it, in writing, to the person to whom the oral direction was given".

Amendment, as amended, agreed to.

Clause 16 agreed to.

Clause 17 debated and agreed to.

Clause 20 debated and agreed to.

Clause 21 agreed to.

Clause 22—

Dame Enid Lyons moved, as an amendment, That after "port" (page 9, line 20) the words "for purposes of information only" be added.

On the motion of Mrs. Blackburn, the following amendment was made, after debate:—

Page 10, line 22, omit "Where the Commission has reason to believe", insert "Upon a written complaint being made to the Commission".

On the motion of Mrs. Blackburn, the following further amendment was made, after debate:-

Page 10, after sub-clause (1.) insert the following sub-clause:—

"(1A.) The onus of proving any allegation contained in a complaint made to the Commission under the last preceding sub-section shall lie on the person by whom the complaint was made.".

Clause, as amended, agreed to. Clauses 28 to 33 agreed to.

Clause 34 debated and agreed to.

Clause 35-

On the motion of Mr. Evatt, the following amendment was made:-

Page 13, line 36, after "Committee" insert "may convene a meeting of the Committee at any time and".

Clause, as amended, agreed to.

Clauses 36 and 37 agreed to.

Clause 38—

On the motion of Mrs. Blackburn, the following amendment was made, after debate:-

Page 15, line 31, omit "shall not be bound to receive evidence, but", insert "shall receive such evidence as in its opinion is necessary for the determination of the appeal, and".

Clause, as amended, agreed to.

Clause 39 debated and agreed to.

Clauses 40 to 50 agreed to.

New clauses-

On the motion of Mr. Evatt, the following new clauses were inserted in the Bill:-

"2A. This Act shall bind the Crown in right of the Commonwealth or a State, Crown to be including any authority of the Commonwealth or a State.".

"13A. Nothing in this Act shall authorize the Commission to determine or Limitation on regulate the salaries, wages, rates of pay or other terms or conditions of service or commission. employment of persons who are not waterside workers.".

"20A .- (1.) The jurisdiction of the Court under any of the last three preceding Exercise of sections shall be exercised by not less than three Judges, unless the Chairman of the jurisdiction. Commission or the deputy of the Chairman of the Commission is a Judge of the Court, in which case that jurisdiction shall be exercised by the Judge of the Court who is the Chairman of the Commission or the deputy of the Chairman of the Commission.

"(2.) Where the jurisdiction of the Court under any of the last three preceding sections is exercised by a Judge of the Court, that Judge may, if he thinks fit, refer any question of law arising in proceedings before him for the opinion of the Court constituted by not less than three

Judges.

"(3.) The Court so constituted shall hear and determine any question referred to it under the last preceding sub-section.".

Title agreed to.

Bill to be reported with amendments.

The House resumed; Mr. Clark reported accordingly. On the motion of Mr. Evatt, by leave, the House adopted the Report, and, by leave, the Bill was

read a third time.

7. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued. Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at four minutes past five o'clock p.m., adjourned until Tuesday next at three o'clock p.m.
