- 2. ALTERATION OF HOUR OF NEXT MEETING .- Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m. Question-put and passed.
- 3. ADJOURNMENT-MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION .- Mr. Menzies (Leader of the Opposition) rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The culpability of the Commonwealth Government for the civil disturbance in the Sydney Domain yesterday, and its responsibility to prevent further organized Communist violence in Australia

Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly-

Mr. Menzies moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued.

5. Message from the Governor-General.--Commonwealth Aid Roads and Works Bill 1947.--The following Message from His Excellency the Governor-General was presented, and was read by Mr. Speaker :-

#### Message No. 16.

Mr. Sheehan

In accordance with the requirements of section fifty-six of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Governor-General recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund sums for the purpose of Financial Assistance to the States to be applied in the Construction, Reconstruction, Maintenance and Repair of Roads and Works connected with Transport, and for other purposes.

Canberra, 19th March, 1947.

Ordered-That the foregoing Message be taken into consideration, in Committee of the whole House, forthwith.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

#### (In the Committee.)

Mr. Ward (Minister for Transport) moved, That it is expedient that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund sums for the purpose of Financial Assistance to the States to be applied in the Construction, Reconstruction, Maintenance and Repair of Roads and Works connected with Transport, and for other purposes.

Question—put and passed.

Resolution to be reported.
