1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—The Deputy Speaker (Mr. Clark) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. SUPPLY—BUDGET DEBATE.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

(In the Committee.)

General debate resumed on the question, That the first item in the Estimates, under Division No. 1.—Senate—namely—

Salaries and allowances £12,000

be agreed to, *and on the Amendment moved thereto by Mr. Harrison, viz.:*—That the first item be reduced by £1.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Hadley reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

3. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Holloway (Minister for Labour and National Service) moved, That the House do now adjourn.
Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at twelve minutes to one o'clock p.m., adjourned until Tuesday next at three o'clock p.m.
