4. Public Works Committee—Reference of Work—Laboratory Building at Geelong, Victoria, FOR WOOL TEXTILE RESEARCH.—Mr. Lemmon (Minister for Works and Housing) moved, pursuant to notice. That, in accordance with the provisions of the Commonwealth Public Works Committee Act 1913-1947, the following proposed work be referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works for investigation and report, namely:—The erection of a Laboratory Building at Geelong, Victoria, for Wool Textile Research.

Mr. Lemmon having laid on the Table sketch plans in connexion with the proposed work—

5. WAR SERVICE HOMES BILL 1949.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time-Debate resumed.

Mr. Deputy Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Clauses 1 and 2 agreed to. Clause 3 debated and agreed to. Clauses 4 to 7 agreed to. Title agreed to. Bill to be reported without amendment.

On the motion of Mr. Lemmon (Minister for Works and Housing), the House adopted the Report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.

6. Snowy Mountains Hydro-electric Power Bill 1949.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time-Debate resumed.

Mr. Lemmon (Minister for Works and Housing) moved, That the debate be now adjourned.
