- 1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.-The Deputy Speaker (Mr. Adermann) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. FLOOD RELIEF--MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.-Mr. Fadden (Treasurer), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of the financial and other assistance given by the Commonwealth Government to the State Governments for flood relief.
- 3. COWRA IMMIGRATION CENTRE-DISTURBANCE-MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.-Mr. Holt (Minister for Immigration), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement with reference to the demonstration regarding food rations which took place at Cowra Immigration Centre on the 17th November.
