20A. No intoxicants or opium shall be allowed to be imported into or manufactured or sold or otherwise disposed of in the Territory except as hereinafter mentioned—

No intoxicants or opium shall be imported into or manufactured in the Territory except by written permission of a person duly authorized by the Lieutenant-Governor and under regulations and conditions to be prescribed by

the Lieutenant-Governor including a provision that such importation or manufacture shall be for medicinal purposes only, and no intoxicants or opium shall be sold or otherwise disposed of in the Territory except for medicinal purposes and on the order of a medical practitioner or person duly authorized by the Lieutenant-Governor.

The penalty for contravention of this section is forfeiture of any goods illegally imported manufactured or sold and a fine of not less than Five pounds or more than One hundred pounds.

Every ordinance passed before the commencement of this Act providing for or permitting the importation manufacture sale or disposal of intoxicants or opium in New Guinea is hereby repealed.
