No. 19.—Census and Statistics Bill.—Clause 9 (as amended)—

9. Every officer appointed or employed, whether permanently or temporarily under this Act, or executing any power or duty conferred or imposed on any officer under this Act or the regulations, shall, before entering upon his duties or exercising any power under this Act, make before a Justice of the Peace or Commissioner for Affidavits a declaration in accordance with the [prescribed] form.

—(The Minister for Home Affairs.)

Further amendment proposed—That the word “prescribed” in the last line be omitted from the clause.

—(Mr. McCay.)

Question—That the word proposed to be omitted stand part of the clause—put.
