Returned by Senate with amendments; Senate’s amendments agreed to, 91. Bill assented to, 104. *Act No. 6 of 1905.*

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CONTRACT IMMIGRANTS BILL.—[“ *A Bill for an Act relating to Immigrants under Contract to perform Manual Labour in the Commonwealth.*”]—Leave given to bring in Bill; brought in and read a first time, 162. Second reading moved, by leave, 162. Second reading, 195. Adjournment of debate negatived, on division, 195. Second reading passed. Committee; reported with amendments, 195; (Standing Orders having been suspended) report adopted, and Bill read a third time, 196. Returned by Senate with amendments; Senate’s amendments agreed to, 213. *Act No. 19 of 1905.*

COPYRIGHT BILL.—[“ *A Bill for an Act relating to Copyright.*”]—Received from the Senate, 133. Read a first time, 134. Second reading, 154, 219. Committee; reported with amendments; and (Standing Orders having been suspended) passed through remaining stages, 219. Returned by Senate agreeing to amendments (one with a consequential amendment), 219. Consequential amendment agreed to, 220. Bill assented to, 227. *Act No. 25 of 1905.*

- IMMIGRATION RESTRICTION AMENDMENT BILL.**—[“*A Bill for an Act to amend the ‘Immigration Restriction Act 1901.’*”]—Leave given to bring in Bill, 161. Brought in and read a first time, 161-2. Second reading moved, by leave, 162. Second reading, on division, 193. Committee; reported with amendments, 193; (Standing Orders having been suspended) report adopted, and Bill read a third time, 194. Returned by Senate with amendments; Senate’s amendments agreed to, 207-8. *Act No. 17 of 1905.*
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- JURY EXEMPTION BILL.**—[“*A Bill for an Act to Exempt certain Persons holding Public Positions in the Commonwealth from serving as Jurors.*”]—Leave to bring in Bill; brought in and read a first time, 1. - KALGOORLIE TO PORT AUGUSTA RAILWAY SURVEY BILL.**—[“*A Bill for an Act to authorize the Survey of Route for a Railway to connect Kalgoorlie in the State of Western Australia with Port Augusta, in the State of South Australia.*”]—Appropriation recommended by Governor-General, 18. Order of the Day discharged, 21.
- LIFE ASSURANCE COMPANIES BILL.**—[“*A Bill for an Act relating to Assurance on the Lives of Children by Life Assurance Companies or Societies.*”]—[*Revived in Senate under Standing Orders re Lapsed Bills*]—Returned by Senate with amendment, 59. Senate’s amendment agreed to, 59. Bill returned by Governor-General and certain amendments recommended, 133. Amendments considered in Committee, 133, 141, 147. Agreed to with amendments; report adopted, 147. Amendments, as amended, agreed to by Senate, 169. Bill assented to, 181. *Act No. 12 of 1905.*
- MANUFACTURES ENCOURAGEMENT BILL.**—[“*A Bill for an Act for the Encouragement of Manufactures in the Commonwealth.*”]—Leave given to bring in Bill, 21. Brought in and read a first time, 31. Motion for second reading; on point of Order Bill ruled out of order under Standing Order No. 243 and not further proceeded with, 33.
- MANUFACTURES ENCOURAGEMENT BILL (No. 2).**—[“*A Bill for an Act for the Encouragement of Manufactures in the Commonwealth.*”]—Appropriation recommended by Governor-General, 33. Governor-General’s Message considered in Committee, and appropriation agreed to; Bill introduced and read a first time, 35. Second reading, 40, 52, 58, 59. Order of the Day for second reading discharged, 198.
- MANUFACTURES ENCOURAGEMENT BILL (No. 3).**—[“*A Bill for an Act to encourage Manufactures in Australia by altering the provisions for bringing into operation Part VI A. of the Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1902.*”]—Brought in on resolution from Committee of the Whole and read a first time, 197. Second reading, 200, 202. Committee; reported with amendments; and (Standing Orders having been suspended) passed through all stages, 202. (*Not returned by Senate.*)

Motion for resumption, under Standing Order No. 214A, of proceedings which lapsed on 15th December, 1904—[*Consideration in Committee of Senate’s amendments in the Bill*], 21. Agreed to, 26. Committee, 129; reported with amendments, 129. Report adopted (on division), 129-30. Amendment on Senate’s amendment agreed to by Senate with an amendment, 153. PRICE AND BAYLY COMPENSATION BILL.—[“ *A Bill for an Act to provide for Compensation to be paid to Colonel Price, C.B., and Lieutenant-Colonel Bayly.*”]—Appropriation recommended by Governor-General, 199. Governor-General’s Message considered in Committee, and appropriation agreed to; Bill introduced and read a first time, 202. Second reading (on division), 224. Committee, 224, 225. (*Lapsed at Prorogation.*)

QUEEN VICTORIA MEMORIAL BILL.—[“ *A Bill for an Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Twenty-five thousand pounds for the purposes of the erection of a Memorial in honour of the late Queen Victoria.*”]—Appropriation recommended by Governor-General, 200. Governor-General’s Message considered in Committee, and appropriation agreed to; Bill introduced and read a first time, 201. Ordered, by leave, That second reading be made an Order of the Day for this day, and that the Bill be passed through its remaining stages this day; Bill passed through remaining stages, 202. Agreed to by Senate without amendment, 208. *Act No. 18 of 1905.*

REPRESENTATION BILL.—[“ *A Bill for an Act relating to the Representation of the several States in the House of Representatives.*”]—Leave given to bring in Bill; brought in and read a first time, 55. Second reading, 76, 79. Committee; reported with amendments, 79. Recommitted for the reconsideration of clauses 3, 4, and 10, and reported with further amendments, 91. Reports, by leave, adopted, 91. Third reading, 95. Returned by Senate with amendments, 147. Senate’s amendment No. 1 agreed to; Nos. 2 and 3 agreed to with amendments, 161. Amendments on Senate’s amendments Nos. 2 and 3 agreed to by Senate, 165. Bill assented to, 181. *Act No. 11 of 1905.*

SEAT OF GOVERNMENT BILL (1905).—[“ *A Bill for an Act to determine more definitely the Seat of Government of the Commonwealth in the neighbourhood of Dalgety, and the territory there within which it shall be, and to provide for the grant to and acceptance by the Commonwealth of the territory, and to provide for other matters in relation thereto.*”]—Appropriation recommended by Governor-General, 208. Governor-General’s Message considered in Committee and appropriation agreed to; Bill introduced and read a first time, 209. Second reading, 215, 219, 222, 224. (*Lapsed at Prorogation.*)

SECRET COMMISSIONS BILL.—[“ *A Bill for an Act relating to Secret Commissions, Rebates, and Profits.*”]—Leave given to bring in Bill; brought in and read a first time, 24. Second reading, 27, 36. Committee, 36, 107, 109. Reported without amendment; report adopted, 109. Recommitted for the reconsideration of clauses 4 and 5 in regard to certain amendments; reported with amendments; and (Standing Orders having been suspended) report adopted; Bill read a third time, 116. Returned by Senate with amendments; Senate’s amendments agreed to, 160. Bill assented to, 169. *Act No. 10 of 1905.*

SERVICE AND EXECUTION OF PROCESS BILL (1905).—[“ *A Bill for an Act to amend the ‘ Service and Execution of Process Act 1901.’*”]—Leave given to bring in Bill; brought in and read a first time, 34. Second reading; Committee; reported without amendment; report adopted, 36. Third reading, 43. Agreed to by Senate without amendment, 54. Bill assented to, 61. *Act No. 5 of 1905.*
