Amendment proposed—That the following words be inserted after the word “Minister” :—  
“provided that the States of Western Australia, South Australia, or both, individually or collectively, undertake to reimburse to the Commonwealth the cost of the survey in the event of the Commonwealth not deciding within five years of the completion of the survey to construct the line,”

Amendment proposed—That the following words be inserted after the word “may” :—“(provided that the States of Western Australia and South Australia shall place under the control of the Commonwealth all Crown Lands for a distance of twenty-five miles on each side of the said railway from terminus to terminus, and that all moneys received from the rental or sales of such land shall be utilized for liquidating the interest on cost of survey and the balance of interest on cost of construction and working account after deducting the earnings of the said railway,)”
